## **Processing the Crime Scene**

- Determine Team Composition
  - The investigator(s) in charge shall assess the scene to determine team composition and specialized resources required.
- Ensure Contamination Control
  - The investigator(s) in charge shall require all personnel to follow procedures to ensure scene safety and evidence integrity.
- Where to start
- Prioritize Collection of Evidence
  - The investigator(s) in charge and team members shall determine the order in which evidence is collected.
- Crime Scene Search Methods
  - The investigator(s) in charge shall consider different search strategies for crime scenes depending upon locale and the number of officials available to aid in searching.
    - Lane or strip search
    - Grid search
    - Zone Search
    - Spiral search
- Collect, Preserve, Inventory, Package, Transport, and Submit Evidence
  - The team member(s) shall ensure the effective collection, preservation, packaging, and transport of evidence.
- Detailed Crime Scene Evidence Collection
  - First responders, investigators and specialized personnel who are properly trained, equipped and prepared shall collect any and all potential evidence.
- Crime scene reconstruction
  - The use of scientific methods, physical evidence, deductive reasoning and their interrelationships to gain explicit knowledge of the series of events that surround the commission of a crime.
  - Blood Stain Pattern Analysis (identity, positions, number of blows, etc.)
  - Firearms (trajectory, shooting distance, GSR, etc.)
